

# Comments from Deacon Dale Brown

Are you trying to strengthen your faith? Are you looking for the right answers? Are there some guestions that you need an answer to? All of us are here today because we love Jesus Christ, and we want to follow him more and more closely. In other words, there is still a gap between the kind of Catholic we would like to be, and the kind of Catholic we actually are. We know that a follower of Christ should be patient, self-controlled, faithful, generous, and kind. And we also know that although we follow that recipe sometimes, many other times we don't. In the face of this contrast between the desire of our hearts and the reality of our daily lives, we can be tempted to frustration. But today the Church is giving us an antidote to that frustration in the example of St Paul. In today's First Reading, St Paul shows up in Jerusalem three years after his dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus. He has been believing in and following Christ for three years already. And yet, he arrives in Jerusalem, and what happens? His bold and abrasive personality gets him in trouble right away. He shows up full of faith and love for Christ, overflowing with zeal and sincerity. But his old violent and intimidating temperament hasn't gone away. In a matter of days, he instills deep fear in the Christians, and he infuriates the Jews so much that they start plotting to kill him! Things are so bad, in fact, that he must be sent away to Tarsus, his hometown, 500 miles away! And notice what happens as soon as he's gone; St Luke writes: "The Church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace." The great St Paul didn't become a saint overnight - it took time for God's grace to transform him, and it takes time for God's grace to transform us too. Do not become frustrated when you are searching for answers, or when looking to improve or deepen your Faith. It does take time, and hopefully you will never stop trying to improve!





#### UPCOMING FEAST DAYS AND SPECIAL DAYS

Sun., 4/28 Fifth Sunday of Easter – known as CANTATA Sunday

**Mon., 4/29** Feast day of <u>St. Catherine of Siena</u> – a 14<sup>th</sup> century Italian girl who dedicated herself to God. She & St. Francis of Assisi were declared CO-PATRONS of Italy. She is patroness of Italy & Europe.

**Tues., 4/30** Feast day of Pope Pius  $V - a \ 16^{th}$  century Italian whose function was to implement the Council of Trent. He is patron saint of Bosco, Marengo, Italy, his birthplace.

### THE MONTH OF MAY IS dedicated to MARY & PRAYING A DAILY ROSARY.

Wed., 5/1 Feast day of St. Joseph the Worker – a skilled carpenter who was given the noble task of watching over the BLESSED MOTHER & JESUS.

**Thurs., 5/2** Feast day of St. Athanasius – a 4<sup>th</sup> century Egyptian, Bishop & Doctor of the Church, who attended the Council of Nicaea & was a formidable defender of the Council's teaching on Christ's divinity. & NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER – in the early 1950's, an evangelical movement led by Rev. Billy Graham, called for Congress & the President to proclaim a NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER.

**Fri., 5/3** Feast day of <u>Saints Philip & James</u> – two ordinary human beings chosen by Jesus to be His Apostles. We are reminded that holiness and its consequent Apostolate are entirely gifts of God, not a matter of human achievement.
